Brandon M. Easton is a professional writer based in




2008. Brandon has written for the 2011 *ThunderCats* reboot from WB Animation and Transformers: Rescue Bots from Hasbro. Easton won the 2012 Glyph Award for his Shadowlaw series and multiple 2014 Glyph Awards for the Watson and Holmes comic series and a 2014 Eisner Award nomination. The Watson and Holmes story was notable for covering issues of human sex trafficking and transgender abuse in NYC. He is also the producer, director and writer of Brave New Souls documentary that explored the aspirations, inspirations and obstacles faced by African-American speculative fiction creators in the 21st century. In 2015, Brandon was selected as one of the eight winners of the 2015 Disney/ABC Writing Program which led to his new position as a Staff Writer for season two of Marvel's Agent Carter. In 2016, Brandon was nominated for the 2nd annual Dwayne

Brandon was a U.S. History and Economics teacher in

In May, IDW Publishing announced Brandon as the writer for the M.A.S.K. reboot comic book series for release in Fall 2016 and in July 2016, Easton was announced as the writer for the VAMPIRE HUNTER D comic book series. Craig Miller is a well-known and respected writer/developer/producer with over 200 credits. He has worked in live-action and animation, written scripts, developed series, pitched to studios and networks, produced, cast, approved storyboards, character designs, and animation - the entire gamut of what goes into creating, selling, and producing a TV series.

Buddies, an animated pre-school series; Basketeers, an animated sports-themed adventure series; Grandpa's Robot, a new series for Latin America; Cheddar Man & the Mysteries of Food, an animated educational series developed for a food channel; Wingin' It, an animated comedy-music series based on a country singer's children's book; two series -Majid and Karamella – created and produced for airing in the Middle East, and Pet Parade, a series for the web. Joelle Sellner began her career as an advertising copywriter, writing award-winning print, radio and television ads for clients such as Lexus, In-N-Out Burger, and Kleenex. Her writing for animated shows includes Sonic Boom, Ben 10: Omniverse, Teen Titans, Shin Chan, and Avengers: Earth's Mightiest Heroes. Her animated web series work includes Mattel's Monster High, Fifi: Cat Therapist for Dreamworks TV and the upcoming Super Slackers, which she created. Joelle has also worked on comics for DC, Marvel, Dynamite and IDW, as well as Lion Forge/Roar Comics (including reboots of NBC classic shows Saved By the Bell and

Punky Brewster). In addition, she has written several live action made-for-cable romantic

adventure series The Real Ghostbusters and The Smurfs. He spent three years writing the multiple-Emmy-winning Curious George for PBS. His most recent work includes developing and writing for: Resistance, a live-action science fiction adventure series; Fortune Teller, a liveaction fantasy adventure that's a mixture of Vampire Diaries and Game of Thrones; Playtime
